Due to a postal issue, the mailing of the April newsletter was delayed. We apologize for any inconvenience and will be repeating some information this month in case you missed them.

The Arts Center is open to the public Tuesday through Friday, 10:00 am to 6:00 pm, Saturday, 10:00 am to 4:00 pm. We are closed on Sunday and Monday. (Hours are subject to change.) Admission is free. We welcome group tours of our galleries and can provide docent-led tours upon request. We are handicap-accessible and follow CDC recommendations for safe operations.

HAMPTON GALLERY & FRONT DESK AREA On-going — Fair Exchange Handmade Baskets & Artist Shelia Stroud — On display is an exhibit of small acrylic artwork by local artist Shelia Stroud.

GALLERY STAIRCASE Now Showing — Mike Sagaser: "Flight School Installation" — Mike is a mixed media, ceramic, mosaic, and digital artist. This loaned installation features molded and painted planes suspending in formation and as an artist's simulation of aerial maneuvers.

"This piece originated as a challenge to create 100 identical copies of the same object to form a stand-alone installation. Each jet is made from stoneware, hand pressed into a plaster cast. bisque-fired, then glaze-fired with an irregular black surface and a single golden "eye." The boundary between human made machine and living thing is blurred by the skin-like texture of each jet's glaze.







"The jet-swarm dives in and out of the rafters like schooling fish effortlessly swimming over our heads immersed in the thin compressible fluid of the air, chasing an unseen goal and responding to unseen forces. From mechanism to body, we feel the flow of power and vulnerability

and wonder at their destination and motivation."

ALL FIRST & SECOND FLOOR GALLERIES

There are pilot programs in chorus at Banks Elementary School under the direction of **Will Sawyer** and Instrumental at Rochelle Middle School directed by **Benjamin Miller**, with additional enrichment pilot programs in both instrumental and choral to be added in the near future.

The TAPS programs are grant-supported from the North Carolina Arts Council, a State agency, and a wonderful way to introduce your child to music, both through instruments and voice. Keys for Kids is a charitable initiative established by North Carolina native and musician Ben Folds in partnership with the North Carolina Arts Council and the North Carolina Arts Foundation. Its purpose is to provide young people in North Carolina, who express an interest in learning to play piano but

have limited opportunity, the access to appropriate lessons and instruments at little to no cost. Working in conjunction with the Arts Foundation and Arts Council, Keys for Kids has created a statewide network of seven nonprofit partners that are providing free or affordable access to piano and keyboard lessons for school-age youth throughout North Carolina. As resources are available, partners are receiving funding, keyboards, and access to branding materials for support for their efforts.

This is a grant-supported program. There is an ongoing recruitment for students. New to Keys to Kids is a concurrent program that will be offered as a pilot for students of Banks Elementary School. **Keys for Kids will continue through the summer.** A few slots are available; ACT NOW! 



Greetings Friends,

This year has already proven to be one of many changes and challenges. In last month's Kaleidoscope I announced my retirement after 26+ years as your Executive Director. The announced date is August 31, after which I will continue as a consultant to the Board of Directors to complete special projects and initiatives while also orienting the new director. It is hoped that this plan will provide a smooth transition for the organization.

Sadly, additional changes in our staffing will occur much sooner than my retirement with the recent resignations of both full-time employees -- Syrina Wimberly, Assistant Director, whose last day was March 22, and Abbye Reynolds, Children's Program Coordinator, who will be leaving in mid April. Syrina completed two full years of employment, first as our Events & Development Director and this past year as the Assistant Director. She brought new energy to many of our existing programs and was extremely engaged in developing our social media presence which has grown exponentially under her care. Early in the Fall of 2023, we proudly launched a new website designed by Syrina. It has proven to be very user friendly and has increased participation in programs, classes, events, concerts, fundraisers, etc. while solidifying our web presence. Her culinary skills were definitely put to use with her menus, food preparation and oversight of kitchens for events large and small, on and off our campus. She wrote curriculums for the summer camps and many other programs, taught classes, organized programs, developed numerous projects, and participated in all events. This past year she was on an administrative track, learning the aspects of oversight of the organization on a day-to-day basis.

Abbye Reynolds has been with the organization for approximately three years, starting as a desk volunteer, then a part-time employee, and early last summer becoming full-time as the Children's Programs Coordinator. Her bright smile and energetic personality have made her the "pied piper" with children. She has brought her unique talents to all that she touches with the development of our year-round children's program and last year, coordinating our summer camps. Whether teaching "Mommy and Me" Yoga, painting, pottery, or many other visual art genres to the young children of Lenoir County, her charges are excited about their projects while learning and developing critical thinking skills. She has masterful skills in relating to both children and parents. Like Syrina and the rest of the staff, Abbye is present at all events.

Both ladies have made significant contributions to the life of the Arts Council and have helped bring us back from the difficult days of closure due to the pandemic. Because of them, along with the other Arts Center staff and our many community partners, the arts are alive in Lenoir County and continue to be an integral part of the life of the community. We are thankful for the many hours and days they have given us, albeit too few, and wish them the best in their future professional endeavors.

In closing, I am respectfully asking for your support in helping me, the Board of Directors, and the remaining staff in completing the myriad of tasks of which Syrina and Abbye were assigned, while at the same time carrying on the many other daily operational activities in addition to our on-going events, fundraisers, membership drive, exhibits, programs, and projects of the Center.
